Thank you for your recent correspondence to the Parliamentary Joint Committee on Human Rights.

The committee considered your correspondence and materials at its meeting of 13 June 2017, and your further correspondence in its meeting of 14 August 2017. I understand that you have received information about the committee's mandate and functions, as well as examples of legislation relating to refugees and asylum seekers about which the committee has commented in its scrutiny reports.

As you are aware, the committee has specific functions including to examine legislation that comes before the Parliament of Australia for compatibility with human rights as defined in the *Human Rights (Parliamentary Scrutiny) Act 2011* and to inquire into existing legislation as well as any matter relating to human rights which is referred to it by the Attorney-General.

Information on the committee's analytical framework and approach to human rights scrutiny of legislation is included at the beginning of each human rights scrutiny report published by the committee, under the heading 'committee information'.
